

BS in Homeland Security

The Bachelor of Science (BS) in homeland security from Wichita State provides students with a foundation in security combined with specialized learning in emergency management, intelligence process, risk assessment, terrorism studies, legal issues in homeland security, and physical, border and cyber security. This four-year program also offers a completely online option. Graduates are well prepared for careers in the security industry at the operational, management and policy levels and in law enforcement at the local, state and federal levels.

Program Requirements

A minimum total of 120 credit hours is required for the BS in homeland security and includes at least 36 credit hours (33 credit hours of core courses and 3 credit hours of electives) in the major that must be completed with a minimum grade point average of 2.000. A minimum grade of a 2.000 must be achieved in all homeland security core and homeland security elective courses. In addition to meeting the requirements of the WSU General Education Program (<http://catalog.wichita.edu/undergraduate/academic-information/general-education-program/>) and the requirements of Fairmount College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (including the world language requirement of 12 credit hours or SPAN 212 Spanish for Law Enforcement - 5 credit hours), students in the BS in homeland security must take the below classes, which includes the additional requirement of ENGL 210 and the 3 credit hours of electives. Students may take 14 additional credit hours beyond the 36 credit hours required for the major.
